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1. Client brief & Methodology

CMK Hort + Arb were commissioned by AECOM to undertake an assessment of trees on the route of a proposed cycleway in the Kinsealy area of North County Dublin. The fieldwork was undertaken on the 2nd of April 2018.

The survey is designed to provide an overview of the trees along the proposed route of the cycleway. It is not a detailed description of tree condition. The vast majority of the trees are within private properties therefore access was not possible.

2. General description of trees

The trees on the route of the proposed cycleway are located within agricultural and estate lands, private gardens, streetscapes and industrial areas (refer to image 1 Proposed Route). The trees within the agricultural and estate lands represent the older mature specimens generally and in most instances are of high landscape value. These include trees within lands south of Kinsealy on the R107 such as Abbeyville and St Doola's Park Care and Rehabilitation Centre where there are large mature beech (Fagus sylvatica) and oak (Quercus robur). There are a number of large holm oaks (Quercus ilex) originating from a former demesne landscape now disused office block (Glandore House) opposite Fingal cemetery. On the boundary of the cemetery there are a number of large mature beech.

Given the close proximity of the sea it is probably not surprising that there are relatively more sycamore (Acer pseudoplatanus) than ash (Fraxinus excelsior) self-seeding in various locations particularly on current or recent agricultural lands. Image 1. Overview of proposd cycle route. The agricultural hedgerows that are scattered over the route are mainly hawthorn



(Crataegus monogyna) in origin with self-seeded or suckering elm (Ulmus procera) common. They also contain occasional ash and sycamore. The elm is prone to contracting Dutch elm disease with the result that no mature specimens were noted. The long-term potential of those that are present is also probably limited.

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Private gardens border the route in many locations. There appears to be limited diversity amongst the tree plantings within these gardens with Leyland cypress (*XCuprocyparis leylandii*), griselinia (*Griselinia littoralis*) and privet (*Ligustrum ovalifolium*) the main boundary hedge types noted. In a number of instances Monterey cypress (*Cupressus macrocarpa*) and Leyland cypress have grown to large sizes and are dominating their local environments.

As might be expected the larger gardens generally contain larger numbers of trees however there are exceptions such as that at the western end of Station Road where a large mature sycamore is located in a very small garden close to a house. Further east along station road there is a boundary planting of poplar (*Populus* spp.) at the edge of farmland and a boundary planting of fastigiate poplar (*Populus nigra* cv) is located to the Malahide end of the R107.

Street trees are located within grass verges adjacent to newer developments on the R123, Feltrim road and Kettle's lane with Norway maple (*Acer platanoides*) and lime (*Tilia* cv) cultivars represented. None of these plantings have reached maturity but all appear to be developing well though formative pruning would be beneficial.




















