Dear Cllr. Healy,

I refer to your request dated 08 May 2023 and received by Uisce Éireann on 09 May 2023 under EU Directive 2003/4/EC (the "**Directive"**) (as transposed by the European Communities (Access to Information on the Environment) Regulations 2007–2018 (the "**Regulations"**) for the following information:

- A copy of the presentation on Drainage Area Plans given to members of Fingal County Council on 28th July 2022;
- A map or maps of the foul and combined sewer network in the Howth Malahide Area showing all outfall locations including surface water overflows at sufficient scale to enable the identification on the ground of all outfall and overflow; locations and the identification of buildings not connected to the sewer network.
- A copy of any correspondence since 1st January 2020 relating to the absence of a foul sewer on Balscadden Road east of Kilrock Road;
- The full database of all overflows, leaks or unplanned discharges from the sewer network in the Howth / Malahide Area since 1st January 2020.

Please note that where your maps, databases etc. cover an area larger than the Howth/ Malahide Area it is not necessary to narrow the search down; I only request that all data is provided at least in relation to the Howth/ Malahide Area as marked on this map:

I have been advised that Uisce Éireann does not have a layer of unconnected premises to the sewer network.

• A copy of any correspondence since 1st January 2020 relating to the absence of a foul sewer on Balscadden Road east of Kilrock Road;

I have been advised by the decision-maker processing this part of your AIE request that Uisce Éireann does not have a sewer located in the Balscadden road (east of Kilrock road). The decision-maker has advised further that the utility does not have any plans to install a sewer along this road. If residents wish to connect to a sewer service they will be required to engage in the new connection process as set out on the Uisce Éireann website.

• The full database of all overflows, leaks or unplanned discharges from the sewer network in the Howth / Malahide Area since 1st January 2020.

I attach the relevant records returned by the decision-maker processing this part of your request. Please note that this information is for the network only, as per your request
